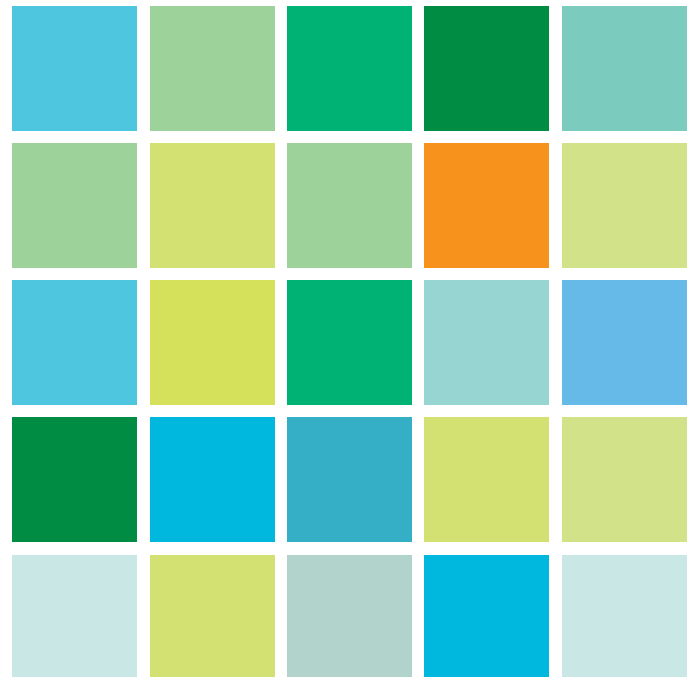

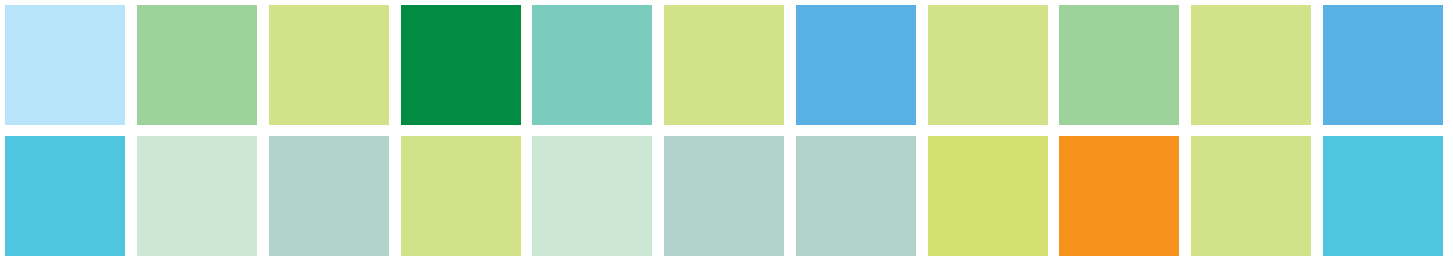

As NHS psychological therapists we find ourselves on the cusp of a radical transformation of our health service: from a 'sickness' service to a 'wellness' service. What part will we have to play in this transformation?

We set ourselves an ambitious objective when we established this conference. We wanted it to 'shape the intellectual climate in which a national strategy for psychological therapies can develop.' Day one of this year's conference will focus on the outline of such a strategy that is beginning to take form through the IAPT programme. At the heart of this vision is the concept of an evidence-based practitioner. Day Two of our conference, Building an Evidence-Based Profession, aims to take the arguments a stage further, and will test whether there is a consensus among us on how we set out to claim our central place in future government priorities. If part of our ambition is for psychological therapies to shape the professional climate in which the NHS delivers health and well-being for all, across society wherever need requires, how shall we lead this reform? No one yet has a blueprint. At last year's conference a number of challenges were thrown down around whether patient choice, for example, or a traditional medical model, should be the dog wagging IAPT's tail? We have assembled some of the keenest, most thoughtful and well-informed minds in the UK, covering a broad spectrum of expertise and perspective, if not to offer final answers, then to pick up these challenges, help stimulate our thinking and lead discussion forward.

In establishing this event annually, the New Savoy Partnership, which represents, as you can see, a growing collaboration of professional and other stakeholders, has created a forum for you to help develop the agenda for contemporary mental health provision. As we begin to forge real partnerships, and a closer relationship with government, how can we work together not only to build an infrastructure for scaling up psychological therapy services throughout the UK, but also to create a New 21st Century Vision for Psychological Therapies? We look forward to welcoming you to Savoy Place in 2008 to hear your views.
